12:00noon | Ghalib starring Tom Alter (Urdu/120mins) The play is a vivacious account of the life and times of Mirza Asadullah Khan Ghalib. The play is punctuated with lots of music, poetry, literary anecdotes and historical episodes.

4:00pm | Ghalib Ke Khat starring Tom Alter (Urdu/90mins) The play is woven around Mirza Ghalib's relationship with his equally learned yet undernated wife Umrao Begum as reflected from the letters that he wrote to his friends and disciples. The play also highlights the wit and spirit of Ghalib's maid Wa'afadar. In the process, the audience is introduced to not only Ghalib - his letters, life and lifestyle, but also to his near and dear ones, including Munshi Har Gopal 'Tattah', a great yet long forgotten poet of Patna.

7:00pm | Ghalib In New Delhi (Hindi Comedy/120mins) This Delhi has been running since 1997, with more than 410 shows. It deals with the re-birth of the renowned 19th century poet Mirza Ghalib's in 21st century New Delhi, highlighting his trials, travails and tribulations - from his second birth in the ISBT in Delhi; to staying in a servant quarter with a Delhi University student from Patna; to dealing with a Punjabi landlady; to becoming a Page-3 celebrity.
